Animals are among the most vulnerable members of our community. Some are strays born on the streets, struggling to stay healthy and at risk of harm by humans and other animals. Others are mistreated by their owners and taken by law enforcement. Changing life circumstances sometimes force people to give up their pets. In many instances, these animals are turned into shelters. If they're lucky, they'll be adopted and find themselves in loving, homes. Unfortunately, this isn't always the case—at many shelters, they are in extreme danger, given only 72 hours for adoption before they are destroyed. Sadly, over 4,100 dogs and cats are killed every day at shelters across the United States.[†]

They are innocent creatures. Given a chance, they'll enrich individuals and families' lives,[‡] while receiving the love and care they deserve. Will you help them find "forever homes?"

We strive to strengthen the human – animal bond and safeguard animals in transition.




Our commitments The values that guide the things we do to advance our mission.

- Develop in-house protocols and knowledge to address common ailments Completed by 2Q2020
- Increase connections with local veterinarians for low-cost spay/neuter and other services Completed by 4Q2020
- Schedule and market more adoption events at locations throughout the region On-going from 1Q2020
- Maintain and increase our live release rates, and make our no-kill status public On-going from 1Q2020





Goal 2—Low-income pet care access

- Maintain and expand relationships with pet stores and other suppliers of pet provisions On-going from 1Q2020
- Engage the community in efforts to offer low-income pet owners food and supplies On-going from 1Q2020
- Develop, fund, and roll out a program for emergency services financial assistance Completed by 4Q2021
- Establish veterinarian partnerships to reduce costs for low-income pet owners In place by 1Q2022
- Create a business plan for increasing access to "sliding scale" veterinary care Completed by 4Q2022
